The origins and therefore the meanings of 'evangelism' and 'mission' are different. Evangelism relates to the evangel: (Latin evangelium, from Greek euangelion = good news) ... the product. Mission is derived from Latin missio, from missus, past participle of mittere, to send off ... the person. So mission is the authority and command to go (like a missile) because it is sent off, and the gospel is the effective agent which is carried with the person who is sent.
